

# Other Chemicals Manufacturing

Other chemical manufacturing industries in Texas include pesticide, fertilizer, & agricultural chemical manufacturing (NAICS 3253); paint, coating, & adhesive manufacturing (NAICS 3255); soap, cleaning compound, and cosmetic manufacturing (NAICS 3256); and other chemical manufacturing (NAICS 3259), which includes printing ink, explosives, photographic films, and custom blending of purchased resins.





## Regional Concentrations

The map at right identifies the state's Workforce Development regions with above-average specializations in other chemical manufacturing. The highlighted regions are not the only areas in Texas where workers in this sector can be found, but rather represent areas with the greatest concentrations relative to the size of the local labor force. These industries are mostly concentrated along the Gulf Coast, as well as near Dallas-Fort Worth and East Texas.

- Annual average wages in these chemical manufacturing sectors increased by 6% between Q3 2013 and Q3 2014.
