GOODFELLOW AIR FORCE BASE – SAN ANGELO, TX

MISSION: The 17th Training Wing is responsible for training more than 14,000 firefighting, intelligence, surveillance, and reconnaissance personnel annually for the U.S. Armed Forces, other government agencies, and allied nations. The 17th Training Wing is also responsible for 12 Air Force specialty code courses with a daily average of 4,000 students.



EXPENDITURES: The FY12 operating budget for Goodfellow AFB exceeded \$110 million. The base maintains and manages real property, equipment, supplies and contract in excess of \$962 million. Goodfellow AFB had an estimated economic impact of \$435.5 million in FY12.

TENANT COMMANDS: Tenant units on Goodfellow AFB include:

- ★ 344th Military Intelligence Battalion – Goodfellow AFB's largest tenant, the U.S. Army's 344th, consists of nearly 220 staff members, helping to train over 2,300 personnel annually
- ★ U.S. Marine Corps Detachment – composed of more than 60 instructors and staff to train and support more than 770 Marines undergoing firefighting and intelligence training each year
- ★ U.S. Navy Center for Information Dominance Detachment – trains nearly 345 personnel annually in full spectrum cyber warfare
- ★ U.S. Department of Transportation – conducts tire testing and provides realty and intra-governmental support for the Highway Traffic Safety Administration

PARTNERSHIPS: Goodfellow AFB and San Angelo have enjoyed a great relationship since 1941. San Angelo's long standing spirit of cooperation is evident in the annual Goodfellow Friendship Golf Tournament and the Goodfellow AFB Appreciation Day, hosted by the city's Chamber of Commerce. With help from the Goodfellow Coordinating Group, a group of community and military leaders who address specific needs of the base, San Angelo will continue supporting the men, women, and missions of Goodfellow AFB.

OUTLOOK: Part of Goodfellow AFB's mission since 1966 has involved joint training. The base is preparing for the future and will complete construction of a 50,000 square foot Joint Intelligence Technical Training Facility in 2013. Through further modernization and construction, the base will continue as a model for joint training missions. With an increasing student loan and space available for mission expansion and consolidation, Goodfellow AFB looks forward to hosting new missions with San Angelo's unwavering support.
