ABOUT THE TEXAS PRODUCTION INCENTIVES

The Texas Moving Image Industry Incentive Program provides cash grants to qualifying projects based on their eligible Texas spend. Our well-established infrastructure includes experienced crew and talent, diverse locations, facilities and support services. Up-front savings include sales tax exemptions, hotel occupancy tax exemptions, and refunds on taxes for fuel used off-road. With these factors combined, projects made in Texas consistently see savings towards the bottom line.

2.5% ADDITIONAL GRANT AWARD

Projects may be eligible to apply for a single additional grant equal to 2.5% of total in-state spending. The bonus must be selected at the time of application and cannot be added retroactively. A project may select only one of the following options to achieve the uplift:

- Completing 25% of total Filming Days in Underutilized or Economically Distressed Areas (UEDAs).
- Demonstrating that 5% of the combined total of paid crew and paid cast, including extras, are Texas Resident Veterans.
- Expending 10% of the total eligible in-state spending on eligible expenditures during postproduction.

APPLICATION DEADLINE

The Texas Film Commission must receive the required application documents by the following timetable:

No later than 5 PM Central Time on the 5th business day prior to the first day of production

APPLICATION DOCUMENTS

The Texas Film Commission must receive the following information within the required application deadline:

- A Qualifying Application Form, to be completed and submitted online. To request a link to the online form, please email the TFC Incentive Department
- 2. An itemized budget detailing only estimated Texas expenditures, submitted online; and
- 3. A content document, submitted online:
 - Feature films and television programs (except episodic television series) should submit a complete script.
 - Episodic television series should submit a complete script of the first episode to be filmed in Texas.
 - Animation and visual effects projects for feature films and television programs should submit a complete script.
 - Animation and visual effects projects for commercials, educational videos and instructional videos should submit a complete script, storyboard or detailed outline/summary of content.
 - Video game and XR projects should submit a brief summary of game content providing sufficient detail concerning the themes, settings, story, characters and events.
 - Commercials, educational videos and instructional videos should submit a complete script, storyboard or detailed outline/summary of content.
 - Reality television projects should submit a detailed treatment or outline/summary of program content.

In addition to an examination of minimum requirements and a review of content, the Qualifying Application Form will be examined in light of the following criteria to assess the potential magnitude of the economic impact of a project in the State of Texas: (i) the financial viability of the Applicant and the likelihood of successful project execution and planned spending in the State of Texas; (ii) proposed spending on existing state production infrastructure (such as soundstages and industry vendors); (iii) the number of Texas jobs estimated to be created by the project; (iv) the ability to promote Texas as a tourist destination through the conduct of the project and planned expenditure of funds; (v) the magnitude of estimated expenditures in Texas; and (vi) whether the project will be directed or produced by an individual who is a Texas Resident (where the term "produced by" is intended to encompass a non-honorary producer with direct involvement in the day-to-day production of the project, but above the level of line producer)

ADDITIONAL TAX EXEMPTIONS

Projects may also qualify for the following tax exemptions administered by the Comptroller's Office:

- Up-front 6.25% 8.25% Sales Tax Exemptions on most items rented, leased or purchased for direct use in production.
- Possible refund from the 6% State Occupancy Tax for hotel rooms occupied for more than 30 consecutive days.
- Refunds on fuel taxes paid on fuel used off-road in generators, boats or in unlicensed vehicles, such as tractors.
