The **Texas Advanced Nuclear Energy Office** (TANEO) was established by <u>House Bill 14</u>, 89<sup>th</sup> Texas Legislature, to provide strategic leadership for advanced nuclear energy in Texas.

TANEO's mission is to support the development and deployment of advanced nuclear reactors and fuel cycle facilities, increase the manufacturing capacity, and develop the workforce required for the advanced nuclear energy industry in Texas. Additionally, TANEO serves as a permitting coordinator, facilitating a streamlined state-level permitting process for prospective advanced nuclear energy projects in Texas.

As TANEO begins its work, we are publishing a Request for Information (RFI) from the public and interested stakeholders in the areas of TANEO's advanced nuclear energy strategic plan development, permitting feedback, regulatory study, and grant application review.
