

Wednesday, January 13: *Pray for all those working on the front line to support survivors.*

Helpful Context:

- Advocates and service providers work tirelessly to provide shelter, crisis intervention, and
 ongoing case management to victims. While many do not understand the trauma endured by
 survivors or fail to recognize their dignity, these programs provide the supportive trust-based
 relationships and services that help survivors heal and thrive. Considering the complex needs of
 survivors and the intensive nature of these causes, those working on the front line may
 experience vicarious trauma and burnout.
- When asked what made the biggest difference in exiting their exploitation, many survivors name an individual rather than a program or service. Advocates on the front line often have the opportunity to build bonds of trust and begin the journey of healing from years of relational trauma.
- Commercially Sexually Exploited Youth (CSEY) Advocacy is a critical component of the Texas
 approach to addressing child sex trafficking. Review <u>this flyer</u> more information on CSEY
