

# SMCISD Campus Crime Stoppers

Starting in August of 2024, the San Marcos campus crime stoppers program was reintroduced. This program allows the SROs, teachers, other staff, and students to work together to take a stand against crime on campus. In addition, the P3 Tips app that crime stoppers utilize is an impactful tool that all campuses within San Marcos can use. The school resource offices conduct investigations on drugs, bullying, alcohol, threats of violence, threats of self-harm, and any other criminal activity occurring on campuses. Since relaunching the Campus Crime Stoppers program, the SROs have investigated 93 tips. Tips include/are not limited to; alcohol, drugs, tobacco, suspicious circumstances, and violent acts on campuses. Out of 93 tips, 27 detentions or arrests have been made (arrest means student was 17 years of age or older; detention means student was under 17).

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## What will I do?



As a new campus crime stoppers ambassador, and having a major role in bringing back and growing SMCISD's campus programs, my biggest goal is to improve student involvement. I plan on doing this by spreading awareness of the benefits of the program, talking to other student groups, organizing events to help recruit other students, and by becoming connected with students on both social media platforms and in school events.

They also work to maintain open communication with students and staff by engaging with them throughout the school day.
