In my article, I'm going to talk about different ways to get students involved in Crime Stoppers. There are many ways to get people involved, not just students, but students should be one of your main targets because they are getting ready to go out into the real world, some not knowing what to expect. Students need to know, understand, and be involved in Crime Stoppers. It helps them get a better feel of the real world and prepares them so that they know what to do if they are ever in any type of trouble. It gives them a safe place to go and tell someone if they see something that might negatively affect anyone. One way to help get students involved and start spreading the word about it is to plan an event of some kind. It doesn't have to be a big event, just something that gives them something to do instead of just sitting around all day doing nothing. Another way is to get some students who are already involved to spread the word because students are more likely to listen to someone closer to their age rather than an adult. Have that student tell them what Crime Stoppers is, so that they understand it. It's not a group of snitches telling on everyone to ruin all the fun, but it's a place someone can go to, to talk to a trusted person about something they saw that could harm someone or something that they heard that can prevent something bad from happening in the future. That they stay anonymous, and people don't do it to hurt someone but to help them and others. Crime Stoppers is a great program to get students and even adults involved so that they know the resources available to them if they or someone they know is in a time of need. Also, the more people that know and understand what it is the better. It gets the word out there that if the right person hears it, it might stay on their mind, or they might look more into it to say if they can help or join it.
